

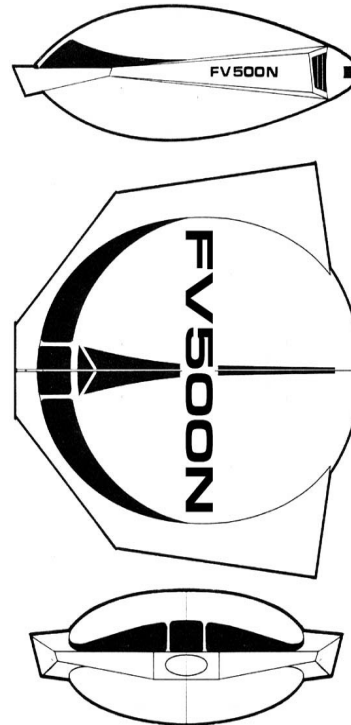
COCHRANE SERIES 500*

ENTERED SERVICE: 2240

OVERVIEW: Created as a private venture starship during the Federation's economic boom of the 2240s and 2250s, the Cochrane Industries Series 500 was designed to appeal to small merchants and prospectors alike while retaining the "organic" Starfleet aesthetic popular at the time.

Unlike more utilitarian rival designs, the Series 500 was streamlined and stylized, at the cost of some minor functionality. The Series 500 boasted a compact, yet powerful (for the time) power plant and comparatively high speed.

Despite its advantages over other designs (such as the *Spacematic* series), the Series 500 enjoyed only a brief heyday and was largely replaced in service by the 2280s.

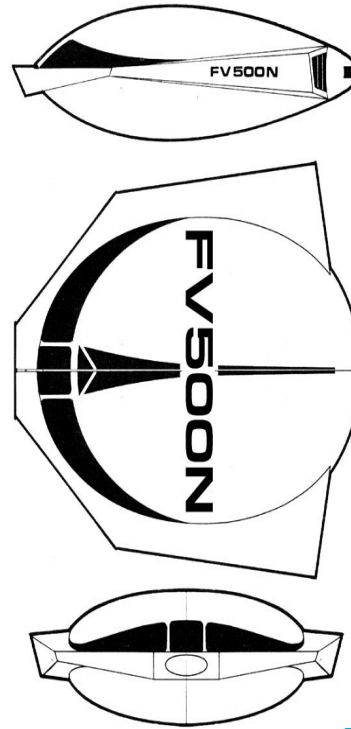
Molly-B.

ENTERED SERVICE: 2242

OVERVIEW: Originally built in the Copernicus City Yard on Alpha Centauri, the *Molly B.* was commissioned by the Starwide Merchants Corporation for executive travel and high-level industry and diplomatic conferences.

Impressed by the luxury and utility of the craft, Federation Ambassador Lothat Graf purchased the craft outright (at exorbitant expense) on behalf of the Federation Diplomatic Corps- one of several poor or questionable decisions which resulted in Graf's recall to Earth and ultimate dismissal.

Since then, the *Molly B.* has languished in a private hangar outside Paris, awaiting either use or sale by a government embarrassed at the reckless excess of one of its own.
